Gus Slodowski Making and repairing finnials



We had the pleasure of a wonderful presentation by Gus Slodowski at our September meeting. Gus provided a very detailed account of how he repairs or crafts replacement wooden finials

A self-taught craftsman, Gus has spent the past 3 years learning and perfecting his skills. He brought some of the many of the tools he uses for turning finials. He has made a number of unique tools and chisels for his work and he described his methods of making them as well as where he sourced some of the materials used in making these custom tools.

Gus also provided a photographic presentation of his lathe and sharpening set up. He has devised a very practical system that accommodates lathe, grinders and saws in and integrated workshop on wheels.

Gus brought several examples of finials showing how in some cases he repaired cracked or broken ones and in other cases manufactured completely new ones.

He demonstrated the design of larger finials that are crafted in sections and then assembled to give the impression of a single piece.

He described his preferred wood types to work with and stressed the need to always use the correct safety equipment when working.

Jim Connel

The NAWCC has lost a long time, stalwart member in the passing of Jim Connell at 93 years of age. Jim was a past member of the Board of Directors and a long serving member of Chapter 33 in Toronto where he held many executive positions. His penchant for Canadian clocks resulted in he and his wife, Marilyn, having a premier collection. Jim's depth of knowledge of Canadian clocks made him a recognized expert and he was a co-author of several books on Canadian clocks. Quite often his advice would be sought with respect to Canadian or early North American clocks and he would provide this with grace and good humor. Along with other Toronto Chapter members. Jim organized the NAWCC Symposium when it was held in Toronto, some years ago. He was awarded the distinction of being a Star Fellow of the NAWCC.

Near the end of WWII Jim trained with the RCAF as a pilot. Jim was a chemical engineer and developed the original formula for flavouring salt and vinegar potato chips - still enjoyed by millions of people worldwide today. He retired in the 1980s. This allowed him several years to enjoy his many pastimes and passions. He and Marilyn travelled extensively, visiting all seven continents. He was a keen archivist of his family's history and the history of Bruce County where he was born. He loved spending time at his family's log home in Pinkerton, Ontario. He was a creative and talented woodworker and produced many beautiful bowls and tables. He could fix anything. Jim had a magnificent sense of humor. More than anything, he enjoyed a good pun and quick repartee. He could quote "Pogo" and recite many pieces in their entirety. And, he mixed an excellent martini.

Our sympathies extend to Marilyn and all their relations. Jim will be missed.
